This is a call for registrations and papers for He Rau Tumu Kōrero – the Māori Historians' Symposium 2011. These one-day symposia showcase the work of Māori researching and writing in Māori historical studies. This year participants are invited to take on the question 'Where Is Māori History?' and to explore and map future directions in the historical representation of Māori and iwi communities.

Locating the Past: Where is Māori History? aims to build on current scholarly shifts away from Treaty and colonial encounter histories towards local Māori and iwi-focused histories across the 19th and 20th centuries. It challenges Māori historians to consider the wider political and academic implications of our work, the flow-on epistemological and methodological concerns, and impacts on the current historiography of Aotearoa New Zealand.
